

WHAT IS THE JESSUP?



- Oldest and largest Moot Court in the world: participants from ca. 700 law schools in 100 countries
- Simulates a dispute before the International Court of Justice in The Hague, the judicial organ of the United Nations
- Public International Law Moot Court Competition
 - Public International Law = disputes between states
 - wide range of topics: from the law of armed conflict and human rights law to WTO law and much more

- Memorial Phase
 - 15 September 2023: release of the 2024 Jessup Problem
 - 12 January 2024: Submission of Memorials
- Pleading Phase
 - 1-2 February 2024: national rounds in Germany
 - 30 March 6 April 2024: international rounds in Washington DC

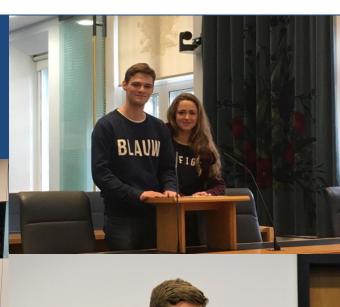
